Always Worth the Wait!

[Jesus said:] "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. ¹³When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. ¹⁴He will glorify me, for he will take what is mine and declare it to you. ¹⁵All that the Father has is mine; therefore I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you... John 16:12–22

This faith community was a mess. Several times during their history, they had a number of successes. A fair number of people had once shown interest in what they were doing, even celebrated it. They had worked through a number of rough patches, detractors, and near disasters. Yet now, about the time it seemed like things might be looking up, everything seemed to go wrong. Despite their best efforts, their numbers had dwindled to only a few. They had experienced betrayal and abandonment. People had failed to live up to their promises and had choked on their own words of undying commitment in some very public ways. Worst of all, death had struck their number and now they appeared leaderless. If you looked around the place where the group gathered, you could say their faces often looked like God Himself had died. So what were there waiting on? What did they have to look forward to? What should they do now?


If this sounds familiar it should. You might say that similar scenes have played out many times among groups of believers past and present. Times of success. Times of decline. Times of failure. Times of loss. Times of God saying, "Yes I will", "No I won't", and "Wait." All of these times have been and are times where God is at work. Yet, for even for an optimistic believer, it can feel like an endless and uncertain wait.

Following Judas's betrayal, the crowds turning on Jesus, Peter's denial, Jesus's death and burial and what immediately followed, things looked pretty grim. Jesus had told them what would ultimately happen, both the good and the bad, but they did not comprehend it. Maybe some were waiting, wondering if there would be anything to the talk about rising after three days. None the less, we know that emotions were high, the doubt among some of them was real, and they were certainly afraid. Call it shock, call it uncertainty, call it disbelief, all they could do it seemed was wait.

Even after Jesus resurrection, while there does seem to be some movement as some of the disciples rushed to tell others that they had seen the Lord, this was not the end of the waiting. As Jesus appears to His disciples and visits with them, he also instructs them to wait. Something else big was coming, and that something was the Holy Spirit. Why didn't Pentecost happen right then? Why not earlier? Why did Jesus have to ascend back up to the Father for the Holy Spirit to be sent the way it was at Pentecost? Why did any of the other good, bad, or ugly things that happened to the disciples have to happen when they did? Honestly, other than the reasons God gives, like Jesus does in John chapter 16, I don't have the answers, except that God knows his own trustworthy and perfect timing.

What I do know is the importance of watching and listening, like we have already been talking about during Lent. If you read all of John chapter 16, you will discover that, like giving birth, the labor of the church, the

sharing of God's word with those who will believe, God's work and restoration in creation and the life of the Christian are not something that all happens in an instant. There will be pain, there will be joy, there will be plenty of yes, no, and wait when it comes to the things we thinks should be part of God's plan for us. It is important to remember that the Holy Spirit and not man birthed the church, but we were blessed to be a part of it. That is why while it is God who ultimately does the work our waiting is not strictly passive. Instead, we wait, we listen, we watch, and we seek to act according to the Lord's lead trusting that God is in control, so that just as Jesus said, "bIn the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world." (John 16:33) May the Spirit fill us and lead us all as we wait and watch, listen and live out the Gospel, this Pentecost season and all year round. Amen.
