PRAYER CARD

If you have a Prayer Request, use the YELLOW card that is available in the narthex, from an usher, or in the pew racks. Ushers will collect the cards before the Sermon so that prayers can be offered during the Intercessions.

If you are visiting with us, please use the Information Update on the reverse side of the card. Include your name and address and other important information. If our congregation can assist you in any way, please put that information on the card or speak to the Pastor.

ASSISTANCE

The ushers can supply parents of small children with soft toys, books, and a weekly children's worship bulletin. The parlor (the room behind the sanctuary) has a loud speaker and window so that, if necessary, parents can use it as a cry room and still see and hear the service. Large-print editions of our worship service are also available from the ushers.

HOLY COMMUNION

Based on the teachings of Scripture and in response to the Lord's admonition that, "A man ought to examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup (1 Cor. 11:28)," we ask that those who attend the Lord's Supper ask of themselves the following questions:

- 1. Do you believe that you are a sinner in need of God's grace? (1 John 1:8-9)
- 2. Are you truly sorry for your sins? (1 Cor. 11:26-29)
- 3. Do you believe in Jesus as your Savior? (Romans 5:6)
- 4. Do you intend with the aid of the Holy Spirit to amend your sinful life? (2 Cor. 5:15)
- 5. Do you believe you receive Christ's true body and blood in the Lord's Supper? (Mark 14:22-24)
- 6. Do you trust God and His promises and accept as true all He teaches in Holy Scriptures? (John 8:31-32)
- 7. Have you been baptized in the Name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit? (Matthew 28:19-20)

If your answer to these questions is yes, then we welcome you to the Lord's Supper. If you have any questions, burdens, or doubts concerning the sacrament, please speak with the Pastor before communing. Adults and children not receiving the Body and Blood of Christ may instead come forward to receive a blessing. Please indicate this by crossing your arms across your chest. Gluten free rice wafers are available. Please indicate this by clearly raising your index finger. Please inform an usher if you are unable to come to the altar; the elements will be brought to you.

The minister enters the sanctuary in silence.

All who are able, stand

The psalm verses are read by the pastor and congregation.

PSALM: Psalm 51:1-13

P Look on me with a heart of mercy, O God,

C according to Your generous love.

P According to Your great compassion,

C wipe out every consequence of my shameful crimes.

P Thoroughly wash me, inside and out, of all my crooked deeds.

C Cleanse me from my sins.

P For I am fully aware of all I have done wrong,

C and my guilt is there, staring me in the face.

P It was against You, only You, that I sinned,

C for I have done what You say is wrong, right before Your eyes.

P So when You speak, You are in the right.

C When You judge, Your judgements are pure and true.

P For I was guilty from the day I was born,

C a sinner from the time my mother became pregnant with me.

P But still, You long to enthrone truth throughout my being;

C in unseen places deep within me, You show me wisdom.

P Cleanse me of my wickedness with hyssop, and I will be clean.

C If You wash me, I will be whiter than snow.

P Help me hear joy and happiness as my accompaniment,

C so my bones, which You have broken, will dance in delight instead.

P Cover Your face so You will not see my sins,

C and erase my guilt from the record.

P Create in me a clean heart, O God;

C restore within me a sense of being brand new.

P Do not throw me far away from Your presence,

C and do not remove Your Holy Spirit from me.

P Give back to me the deep delight of being saved by You;

C let Your willing Spirit sustain me.

P Then I will teach transgressors your ways,

C and sinners will return to you.

P Deliver me from bloodguiltiness, O God, O God of my salvation,

C and my tongue will sing aloud of your righteousness.

EXHORTATION

P: Brothers and sisters: God created us to experience joy in communion with him, to love all humanity, and to live in harmony with all of his creation. But sin separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, and so we do not enjoy the life our Creator intended for us. Also, by our sin we grieve our Father, who does not desire us to come under his judgment, but to turn to him and live.

As disciples of the Lord Jesus we are called to struggle against everything that leads us away from the love of God and neighbor. Repentance, fasting, prayer, and works of love – the discipline of Lent – help us to wage our spiritual warfare. I invite you, therefore, to commit yourselves to this struggle and confess your sins, asking our Father for strength to persevere in your Lenten discipline.

There is silence for reflection and self-examination.

CONFESSION

P: Most holy and merciful Father:

Q: We confess to you and to one another, and to the whole communion of saints in heaven and on earth, that we have sinned by our own fault in thought, word, and deed; by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.

G: Have mercy on us, Lord.

P: We have been deaf to your call to serve as Christ served us. We have not been true to the mind of Christ. We have grieved your Holy Spirit.

C: Have mercy on us, Lord.

P: We confess to you, Lord, all our past unfaithfulness. The pride, hypocrisy, and impatience in our lives,

©: we confess to you, Lord.

P: Our self-indulgent appetites and ways, and our exploitation of other people,

C: we confess to you, Lord.

P: Our anger at our own frustration, and our envy of those more fortunate than ourselves,

C: we confess to you, Lord.

P: Our intemperate love of worldly goods and comforts, and our dishonesty in daily life and work,

C: we confess to you, Lord.

P: Our negligence in prayer and worship, and our failure to commend the faith that is in us,

G: we confess to you, Lord.

P: Accept our repentance, Lord, for the wrongs we have done. For our blindness to human need and suffering, and our indifference to injustice and cruelty,

G: accept our repentance, Lord.

P: For all false judgments, for uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbors, and for our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us,

©: accept our repentance, Lord.

P: For our waste and pollution of your creation, and our lack of concern for those who come after us,

©: accept our repentance, Lord.

P: Restore us, good Lord, and let your anger depart from us.

Q: Hear us, Lord, for your mercy is great. Amen

IMPOSITION OF ASHES

Those who desire to receive ashes may come forward and kneel at the rail.

Worshipers who prefer not to receive ashes may remain at their pew and spend the time in quiet meditation.

During this time, you may wish to turn to page 239 in the <u>Lutheran Book of Worship</u> and meditate on Psalm 51.

The pastor returns to the sanctuary to continue the service.

P: Accomplish in us, O God, the work of your salvation.

Q: that we may show forth your glory in the world.

P: By the cross and Passion of your Son, our Lord,

Q: bring us with all your saints to the joy of his resurrection.

P: Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, does not desire the death of sinners, but rather that they may turn from their wickedness and live. Therefore, we implore him to grant us true repentance and his Holy Spirit that those things may please him which we do on this day, that the rest of our life may be pure and holy, and that at the last we may come to his eternal joy; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

C: Amen

SALUTATION AND PRAYER OF THE DAY

P: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you.

D: Let us pray. Almighty and everlasting God, You despise nothing You have made and forgive the sins of all who are penitent. Create in us new and contrite hearts that lamenting our sins and acknowledging our wretchedness we may receive from You full pardon and forgiveness; through Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

G: Amen

FIRST LESSON: Joel 2:12-19, Return to God

"Yet even now," declares the LORD, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; ¹³and rend your hearts and not your garments." Return to the LORD your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster. ¹⁴Who knows whether he will not turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind him, a grain offering and a drink offering for the LORD your God? ¹⁵Blow the trumpet in Zion; consecrate a fast; call a solemn assembly; ¹⁶gather the people. Consecrate the congregation; assemble the elders; gather the children, even nursing infants. Let the bridegroom leave his room, and the bride her chamber. ¹⁷Between the vestibule and the altar let the priests, the ministers of the LORD, weep and say, "Spare your people, O LORD, and make not your heritage a reproach, a byword among the nations. Why should they say among the peoples, 'Where is their God?'" ⁸Then the LORD became jealous for his land and had pity on his people. ⁹The LORD answered and said to his people, Behold, I am sending to you grain, wine, and oil, and you will be satisfied; and I will no more make you a reproach among the nations.

P: The word of the Lord. **Q:** Thanks be to God!

SECOND LESSON: 2 Corinthians 5:20b—6:10, Now is the day of salvation

We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. ²¹For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God. ^{6:1}Working together with him, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. ²For he says, "In a favorable time I listened to you, and in a day of salvation I have helped you."

Behold, now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. ³We put no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, ⁴but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: by great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, ⁵beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger;

⁶by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love; ⁷by truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; ⁸through honor and dishonor, through slander and praise.

We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; ⁹as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold, we live; as punished, and yet not killed; ¹⁰as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, yet possessing everything.

P: The word of the Lord. **C**: Thanks be to God!

P: The Holy Gospel according to Matthew, the sixth chapter.

"Beware of practicing your righteousness before other people in order to be seen by them, for then you will have no reward from your Father who is in heaven. ² "Thus, when you give to the needy, sound no trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may be praised by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. ³ But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, ⁴ so that your giving may be in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you. ⁵ "And when you pray, you must not be like the hypocrites. For they love to stand and pray in the synagogues and at the street corners, that they may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. ⁶ But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you. ¹⁶ "

And when you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. ¹⁷ But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, ¹⁸ that your fasting may not be seen by others but by your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you. ¹⁹ "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, ²⁰ but lay up for yourselves

treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. ²¹ For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.






