PRAYER CARD

ASSISTANCE

The ushers can supply parents of small children with soft toys, books, and a weekly children's worship bulletin. The parlor (the room behind the sanctuary) has a loud speaker and window so that, if necessary, parents can use it as a cry room and still see and hear the service. Large-print editions of our worship service are also available from the ushers.

HOLY COMMUNION

Based on the teachings of Scripture and in response to the Lord's admonition that, "A man ought to examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup (1 Cor. 11:28)," we ask that those who attend the Lord's Supper ask of themselves the following questions:

1. Do you believe that you are a sinner in need of God's grace? (1 John 1:8-9)
2. Are you truly sorry for your sins? (1 Cor. 11:26-29)
3. Do you believe in Jesus as your Savior? (Romans 5:6)
4. Do you intend with the aid of the Holy Spirit to amend your sinful life? (2 Cor. 5:15)
5. Do you believe you receive Christ's true body and blood in the Lord's Supper? (Mark 14:22-24)
6. Do you trust God and His promises and accept as true all He teaches in Holy Scriptures? (John 8:31-32)
7. Have you been baptized in the Name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit? (Matthew 28:19-20)

If your answer to these questions is yes, then we welcome you to the Lord's Supper. If you have any questions, burdens, or doubts concerning the sacrament, please speak with the Pastor before communing. Adults and children not receiving the Body and Blood of Christ may instead come forward to receive a blessing. Please indicate this by crossing your arms across your chest. Gluten free rice wafers are available. Please indicate this by clearly raising your index finger. Please inform an usher if you are unable to come to the altar; the elements will be brought to you.

(P: pastor A: assistant C: congregation)

CONFESSiON AND FORGIVENESS

P: In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen

P: The day of the Lord is coming soon. The signs have been fulfilled.

C: **But who can abide the day of his coming, and who can stand when he appears?**

P: Lest that Day surprise us unawares, let us confess our sins to God our Father, imploring his forgiveness for the sake of Jesus Christ, who will soon come as Judge and King.

Silence for reflection and self-examination

P: Most merciful God,

C: **We are unprepared for your coming, for we have sinned. In our thinking and speaking and doing, we have disobeyed your will. We have ignored the signs of Christ's return. We implore your forgiveness for the sake of Jesus Christ and seek the power of your Holy Spirit to restore our faith.**

P: He who is coming has come, born among us to live our life and die our death, and guarantee our resurrection. For his sake your sins are forgiven. The gifts of the Lord are yours in great abundance.

C: **Even so, come, Lord Jesus! Amen**

THE SERVICE OF THE WORD

FIRST LESSON: Isaiah 2:1-5, *Weapons of war transformed into instruments of peace*

The word that Isaiah the son of Amoz saw concerning Judah and Jerusalem. ²It shall come to pass in the latter days that the mountain of the house of the Lord shall be established as the highest of the mountains, and shall be lifted up above the hills; and all the nations shall flow to it, ³and many peoples shall come, and say: “Come, let us go up

to the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob, that he may teach us his ways and that we may walk in his paths.”

For out of Zion shall go the law, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem. ⁴He shall judge between the nations, and shall decide disputes for many peoples; and they shall beat their swords into plowshares, and their spears into pruning hooks; nation shall not lift up sword against nation, either shall they learn war anymore. O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord.

A: The word of the Lord.

C: Thanks be to God!

PSALM 122

The psalm is read responsively by the pastor and congregation. The pastor begins.

P: I rejoiced when I heard them say: “Let us go to the house of the Lord.”
And now our feet are standing within Jerusalem.

C: Come, let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

P: Pray for peace, pray for peace, pray for peace within us forever.

C: Come, let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

P: For the love of my family and friends, may the peace of our God be with you.
For love of the house of the Lord,
I will pray that his kindness be with you.

C: Come, let us go rejoicing to the house of the Lord.

SECOND LESSON: Romans 13:8-14, Salvation is near; time to wake from sleep

⁸Owe no one anything, except to love each other, for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. ⁹For the commandments, “You shall not commit adultery, You shall not murder, You shall not steal, You shall not covet,” and any other commandment, are summed up in this word: “You shall love your neighbor as yourself.” ¹⁰Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfilling of the law.

¹¹Besides this you know the time, that the hour has come for you to wake from sleep. For salvation is nearer to us now than when we first believed. ¹²The night is far gone; the day is at hand. So then let us cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light. ¹³Let us walk properly as in the daytime, not in orgies and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and sensuality, not in quarreling and jealousy. ¹⁴But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires.

Alleluia. Show us your mercy, O Lord, and grant us your salvation. Alleluia.

GOSPEL: Matthew 24:36-44, The sudden coming of the Son of Man

P: The Holy Gospel according to Matthew, the twenty-fourth chapter.

C: Glory to you, O Lord!

“But concerning that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only.³⁷For as were the days of Noah, so will be the coming of the Son of Man.³⁸For as in those days before the flood they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the ark,³⁹and they were unaware until the flood came and swept them all away, so will be the coming of the Son of Man.

⁴⁰Then two men will be in the field; one will be taken and one left.⁴¹Two women will be grinding at the mill; one will be taken and one left.⁴²Therefore, stay awake, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming.

⁴³But know this, that if the master of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into.⁴⁴Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect.
