Have Things Gotten Off Course?



Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. ⁵ You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your might. ⁶ And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. ⁷ You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. ⁸ You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. ⁹ You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates. (Deut. 6:4-9)

¹⁶ For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. ¹⁷ For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, "The righteous shall live by faith." (Rom. 1:16-17)

Ever felt like you or the world needs a course correction? Throughout human history, God has worked through various individuals to correct the course of His children and the church and draw them closer to Him. Worthwhile change in the behavior of the church, society, and individuals is always an act of God through the power of his Holy Spirit. As God's Word points out, He alone is the source of all that is good, right, pure. Salvation comes through the power of God's Grace alone, through faith alone in Christ alone, and it is God's Word alone, through which we receive this grace and are able to seek and follow God's will. God also uses us to carry out His work and speak His word into our life and the lives of others. Each Christian plays an important part in our homes, churches, and communities as we faithfully study God's word and will for his people, then speak and model the truth in love to those around us. In our many roles, such as parent, teacher, family member, and neighbor, these basic acts of faith can have a massive, if sometimes hidden, impact. Each act can shape the world around us (especially our children and those closest to us) in ways we may never fully see. However, sometimes one simple act of faith can also ring out with an impact we never would have imagined.

In October of 1517, a German monk named Martin Luther nailed 95 thesis (statements of belief) to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg. As a teacher and theologian, this action was not as unusual as we might think. Posting something on the door was a little like publishing a paper for professional review, or in a more everyday way of thinking, posting something you feel is important and up for discussion on social media. Don't misunderstand me, the content of what Luther posted was significant. Others had faced serious consequences for challenging the church and the status quo. However, I question whether, when Luther's hammer hit that nail, or he shared these 95 theses with others, he had expected the resounding shockwaves that would be sent throughout the world.

Perhaps the most well-known part of these 95 theses challenged how the gospel message of full forgiveness gained solely through the work of Jesus Christ had been replaced by a system where "grace" was bought for the price of human works and currency. Yet, as Luther studied the scriptures, he quickly found out that the church had far more issues than this abuse, commonly referred to as indulgences. Guided by God's Word, and with the help of the recently invented printed press, the Protestant Reformation was underway.

MARTIN LUTHER: REFORMING MARRIAGE AND FAMILY

Among Luther's list of areas that needed to be reformed, marriage proved to be one of the central issues. Luther garnered much criticism when he broke his monastic vows of celibacy to marry an escaped Benedictine nun named Katharina von Bora. This, however, became the hub for a reformation of marriage. The Luther home, with Katharina playing an important roll, became the testing ground for Martin's understanding of a Biblically defined family, in which God's Word was studied and central to everyday living and relationships.


