### **HOLY COMMUNION**

Based on the teachings of Scripture and in response to the Lord's admonition that, "A man ought to examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup (1 Cor. 11:28)," we ask that those who attend the Lord's Supper ask of themselves the following questions:

- 1. Do you believe that you are a sinner in need of God's grace? (1 John 1:8-9)
- 2. Are you truly sorry for your sins? (1 Cor. 11:26-29)
- 3. Do you believe in Jesus as your Savior? (Romans 5:6)
- 4. Do you intend with the aid of the Holy Spirit to amend your sinful life? (2 Cor. 5:15)
- 5. Do you believe you receive Christ's true body and blood in the Lord's Supper? (Mark 14:22-24)
- 6. Do you trust God and His promises and accept as true all He teaches in Holy Scriptures? (John 8:31-32)
- 7. Have you been baptized in the Name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit? (Matthew 28:19-20)

If you have any questions, burdens, or doubts concerning the sacrament, please speak with the Pastor before communing. Adults and children not receiving the Body and Blood of Christ may instead come forward to receive a blessing. Please indicate this by crossing your arms across your chest. Gluten free rice wafers are available. Please indicate this by clearly raising your index finger. White grape juice is available in the center of the individual cup tray for those unable to receive wine. Please inform an usher if you are unable to come to the altar; the elements will be brought to you.

### PROCESSIONAL GOSPEL

Mark 11:1-11, Jesus enters Jerusalem

Now when they drew near to Jerusalem, to Bethphage and Bethany, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples <sup>2</sup>and said to them, "Go into the village in front of you, and immediately as you enter it you will find a colt tied, on which no one has ever sat. Untie it and bring it. <sup>3</sup>If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' say, 'The Lord has need of it and will send it back here immediately." <sup>4</sup>And they went away and found a colt tied at a door outside in the street, and they untied it. <sup>5</sup>And some of those standing there said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" <sup>6</sup>And they told them what Jesus had said, and they let them go. <sup>7</sup>And they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it, and he sat on it. <sup>8</sup>And many spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut from the fields. <sup>9</sup>And those who went before and those who followed were shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord! <sup>10</sup>Blessed is the coming kingdom of our father David! Hosanna in the highest!"






### The Words of Our Lord
